JASLIN SALMON is President/CEO of the International Institute for Social, Political and Economic Change (IISPEC), a think tank, devoted to research, consultancy and advocacy. He is past Vice President of the Geneva-based International Federation of the Red Cross & Red Crescent Societies, and is the Immediate Past President of the Jamaica Red Cross. He is sociologist who is also trained in Counselling and Psychotherapy. He obtained a B.A. from Olivet Nazarene University in Illinois, 1968, a M.A. in Sociology and Counselling Psychology from Ball State University in Indiana, 1969, and a Ph.D. in Sociology from the University of Illinois in Chicago, Illinois, 1977. For 28 years he held Academic positions in several institutions in the USA, culminating in a Professorship at Triton College in suburban Chicago, Illinois, for over twenty years. While in the USA he was a key leader in the NAACP, a major civil rights organisation. Having spent almost all his adult life in the USA, he returned to Jamaica in 1997 to take up the position of Advisor in the Office of the Prime Minister and head of the National Poverty Eradication Programme. He is the author of three books and numerous scholarly articles. His latest book, "Parenting: A Child's Perspective", was published in October, 2007, and was serialised in the Jamaica Gleaner.
